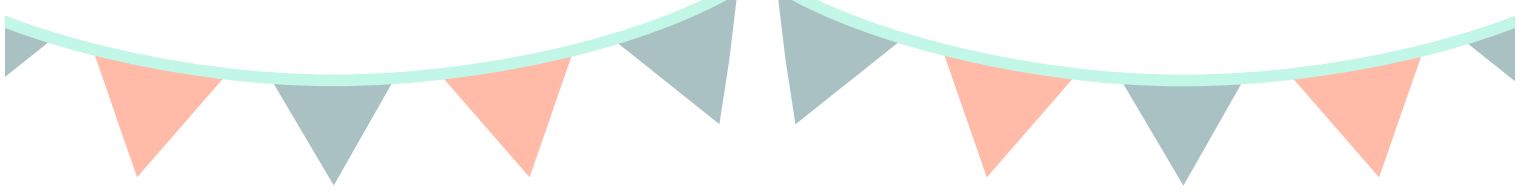




Family Easter Photo Scavenger Hunt

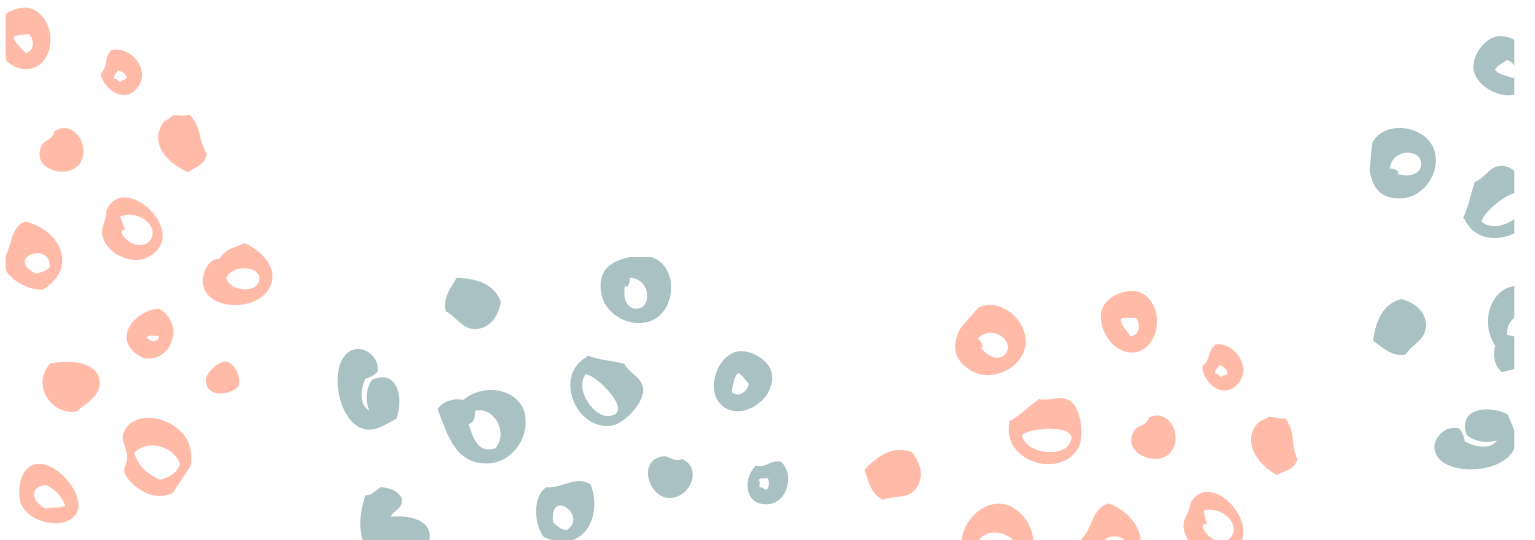
May your home be full of joy as

Instructions:

**We will be having a photo scavenger hunt today!
This can be done inside or outside! Feel free to use in whatever way works best for your family!**





#1

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: Luke 23:34

Step 2: Find/create a branch or a twig. Then, take a photo of the family holding the object found or created.

Step 3: You say, "Branches are often used as a symbol to represent reconciliation or forgiveness"

Step 4: Discuss: What did Jesus want God the Father to forgive?

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: Luke 23:39-43

Step 2: Find/create an object that is alive (ie: a flower, bird, tree, bug, etc). Then, take a photo of the family holding (or pointing to) the object found or created.

Step 3: You say, "Looking at God's creation helps to set our gaze on the beauty of heaven."

Step 4: Discuss: How do we see God's goodness in Jesus' response to the thief? What do you think paradise is like?

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: John 19:26-27

Step 2: Take a family selfie or draw a picture of your family.

Step 3: You say, "Family is really important to Jesus. We were created to be in community."

Step 4: Discuss: How do we see Jesus care for his family through what He said as He was dying? How do we care for our family like Jesus demonstrated on the cross?

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: Matt. 27:46

Step 2: Play a round of hide and seek where kids hide and caregivers are IT. Take a selfie with each family member in the spot where they were found.

Step 3: You say, "When you hide, you experience the silence and darkness of being all alone. Jesus was honest about how He felt."

Step 4: Discuss: When you feel alone, do you also cry out to God for help?

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: John 19:28

Step 2: Get a bottle of vinegar from your kitchen. Pour some in a cup and have as many family members as would like to participate, dip their finger in the vinegar and then taste it. Take a photo of their reaction!

Step 3: You say, "Thirst is a human experience, something we all have in common. Vinegar is not a refreshing drink. Jesus was so thirsty and this is what they offered Him to drink.

Step 4: Discuss: What does it feel like to be thirsty? What other human experiences did Jesus have in His life?

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: Luke 23:46

Step 2: Create unique hand art by tracing, molding with Play-Doh, painting, or free drawing hands. Then take a photo of what you created together.

Step 3: You say, "Jesus obeyed God His entire life, even until His very last breath. He trusted the Father completely by giving up His spirit into God's care."

Step 4: Discuss: As a family, what are some areas where you can commit to trusting in God more? How will you do that?

Step 1: Look up this Scripture and read it together: John 19:30

Step 2: Have each family member use the stencil provided to trace the crown onto a sheet of blank paper. Make it your own! Go all out by using colored pencils, water color, acrylic paint, crayons, or markers! Be creative and have fun!

Write, "It is finished" below the crown. Take a group photo with each family member holding their crown art!

Step 3: You say, "Jesus gave up His life and completed redemption."

Step 4: Discuss: As a family, each take a turn praising the Lord for His gift of salvation.
